Title of Bill: Airport Security

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS

1 Be it enacted by the House of Congress of the United States of America in Congress
2 assembled, that the committee of Foreign Affairs is presenting the bill to step up security at
3 all American Airports and as well as other airports with flights to America. Since the
4 September 11th attacks there have been several attempts to target flights directed to or from
5 America. Many people have complained that their privacy is being violated because of all
6 the security checks they must go through, but the committee of Foreign Affairs is asking for
7 tighter security even if it means less privacy because saving lives is more important than
8 privacy.

10 SECTION I All passengers returning to America from any foreign nation must go through
11 all available methods of security checks at the airport they will depart from.

13 SECTION II All passengers leaving America to another nation must go through the same
14 extent of security as stated in Section 1 lines 10-11

16 Section III All passengers on any flight must go through the new full body X-Ray Machine
17 behind closed doors in order to detect any hidden weapons.

19 Section IV Pilots will be armed with a stun-gun, to add to the security of the US Marshalls
20 already on board.

22 Section V All passengers must wear a wristband or some sort of noticeable band, or sticker
23 which shows they have been cleared and thoroughly checked by airport security.

25 Section VI If this bill is to be passed, it will go in to effect 6 months from its passage.
