**Title of Bill: Tightening Security on Trains and the Railways**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS

1 Preamble: Whereas the security of train stations and the trains themselves can often fall into  
2 disregard, especially after the huge attack on September 11, 2001 it is important that these  
3 methods of transportation are constantly monitored. The stations now have the basic  
4 security that is needed to stop the basic threats, but we must also consider the dangers for  
5 the average person on the trains and walking the tracks.

7 Section 1: There have been many deaths in the most recent years involving people that walk  
8 the tracks. It is proposed that the tracks be lit at certain key points that would make it easier  
9 for the pedestrians to see the trains and hopefully to prevent these types of tragic events.  
10 The lights would serve as streetlights do on highways, making the tracks clearly visible and  
11 obstructions visible to both the pedestrian and the train operator.

12 Section 2: Also, to prevent people from walking on the tracks at extremely dangerous areas  
13 walls and barriers should be constructed to keep them out. It would serve as a way to keep  
14 people away for their own safety and to prevent the deaths of innocent pedestrians.
