Title of Bill: Expansion of Drug Enforcement

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS

1 PREAMBLE: Whereas the usage of drugs has expanded many times in recent decades, this
2 committee would like to establish a bill that would significantly increase the methods and
3 means which the DEA and local agencies have to fight the ongoing drug epidemic. Drugs
4 and their rampant usage and illegal distribution are contributing to the degradation of
5 American society. Health concerns are great when drugs are abused, and since illegal
6 groups provide and sell drugs, crime rates do rise.

8 SECTION 1- The Federal Drug Enforcement Agency is limited in it's scope of
9 effectiveness. In order to heighten its effectiveness, its budget will be increased in the three
10 areas it focuses on.

11 Drug Demand Reduction- Currently appointed at \$3.3 million,
12 the budget will expand to \$4 million dollars annually, to
13 increase various attempts at public education and
14 rehabilitation.

16 Drug Related Crime- To be expanded from \$181 million to
17 \$200 million. Because of the illegality of drug rings, this must
18 be tackled to curtail the domestic suppliers of drugs.

20 Breaking Foreign and Domestic supplies- To be expanded
21 from 1.015 billion to 1.1 billion dollars to prevent such things
22 from gaining access to our country.

24 SECTION 2- Efforts to develop awareness and preventative measures for the public have so
25 far proven less than successful for many. A new method of addressing factors that would
26 lead to drug behaviors must be created. Additional funds unspecified will go towards the
27 development of a new drug prevention program that will be used to prevent people from
28 using drugs. The program must be developed by behavioral scientists and psychologists to
29 truly address what will and will not help dissuade people from doing drugs in the future.
