Title of Bill: A Second Day of Remembrance

Be It Enacted By The Congress

1Preamble: Whereas the final Monday of every May is Memorial Day, a day of remembrance
2for those people who lost their lives during war-time, and since there currently is no day of
3remembrance for civilians who lost their lives either in a natural disaster or attack on United
4States soil, and since there is no day of remembrance for those who lost their lives on
5September 11th, 2001,

7SECTION 1: Let the first Tuesday of every September be a nationally, annually observed
8holiday, known as Remembrance Day.

9 Sub-SECTION A: This holiday would encompass a remembrance of the
10deaths of those who died on American soil from a situation beyond our control, such as a
11natural disaster or attack from a foreign nation.

12 Sub-SECTION B: The reason the holiday would be observed on the first
13Tuesday of every September is to honor the day of the September 11th terrorist
14attacks.

16SECTION 2: Let all federal and state government facilities and offices be closed for the
17entire day, less they need to remain in operation, such as police, fire, and emergency
18services.

20SECTION 3: Let all publicly operated facilities and businesses be closed for the entire day,
21less they need to remain open, such as grocery stores and gas stations.

23SECTION 4: Let all learning institutions, be they public or private, at all education levels be
24closed for the entire day.

25

26SECTION 5: This bill shall go into effect immediately, as to be sure it is ready to take effect
27for the first Tuesday of September of this year, 2010.
