**Title of Bill:**  
**English as the primary language of the United States of America**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS

- 1 Preamble: Whereas America is the melting pot of the world and all of its cultures and ways  
2 of life, it is necessary for the government to attain a universal American language as a  
3 means of communication between all citizens of the country, and as immigrants continue to  
4 inundate the United States with their unique languages and dialects, they should be given  
5 the opportunity to learn and speak our country's official language with ease by using  
6 already standing schools where this learning can take place,  
7  
8 SECTION 1: Let the definition of English be the language of Americans with a classical  
9 dialect and no slang, and let this language be proclaimed the official language of the United  
10 States of America.

12 SECTION 2: Let the language defined in SECTION 1 be accepted all over the United States  
13 and usage of it enforced.  
14  
15 SECTION 3: Let all immigrants coming into the country, all illegal aliens, and all those  
16 who are new citizens to the United States or those who cannot speak or comprehend English  
17 have the opportunity to receive that crucial education through schooling.  
18  
19 SECTION 4: Let all people in the United States use this schooling to better their English  
20 and let the government fund cost free institutions and schools where this learning can take  
21 place.

23 SECTION 5: Let there be instruction of English inside public schools all over the country  
24 for easy access to learning to ensure that all Americans who wish to, and need to, learn  
25 more of the official language of the United States enjoy receiving their education, and not  
26 need to travel long distances to arrive at their educational destination.

28 SECTION 6: This bill shall go into effect 90 days after passage.
