

# HI 113 CONGRESS SIMULATION 2010

**Title of Bill: Finger Printing Act**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS

1 PREAMBLE: The passing of the Finger Printing Bill will create a state and national  
2 database holding the finger prints of all United States citizens. This bill will allow easier  
3 access to finger print information for state and federal crimes. This finger printing  
4 information will also help with the regulation of illegal immigrants.

6 SECTION ONE: As of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the year following the time the bill is passed, all  
7 newborns as part of their birthing registration will be required to get fingerprinted and have  
8 their prints put into the State and Federal database. Finger printing will take place at the  
9 town court houses and information will be sent to the FBI database for entry into the  
10 system.

12 SECTION TWO: As of 12 months after the pending passage of bill all United States  
13 Citizens will be required to have their fingerprints taken and put into a State and Federal  
14 data base. All new citizens to the country will be finger printed upon their citizenship being  
15 granted. This database will be accessible by the State Police Departments and the Federal  
16 Bureau of Investigation. The main database will be located within the Pentagon Building in  
17 Washington D.C. All databases for the State Police will be located in the State Houses of  
18 each state. Departments of the state police will be granted access upon department approval  
19 based necessity of finger prints.

21 SECTION THREE: let the punishment for failing to comply with registration deadlines be a  
22 first offense fine of \$750 per person. Second offense would result in a fine of \$1250 per  
23 person. Third offense of unwillingness to comply would be a federal charge resulting in a  
24 minimal sentence of 180 days. Any minor that does not comply to the finger printing  
25 process is to be held under the responsibility of their parents or guardians.

27 SECTION FOUR: let the funds for this program come from a percentage of monetary  
28 income to the courts through fines and bail. Let the percentage be 5%. These funds will  
29 cover employment, system maintenance, fingerprinting supplies.

31 SECTION FIVE: Access to the state police finger print database will be granted upon  
32 approval of the State Police Department depending on severity of crime and necessity of  
33 finger print use. Access to database for federal crimes will be granted by an official board  
34 of three people within the FBI hired by the head of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The  
money acquired through Section Three will pay for the salaries of these three members.

Enacting Clause: Upon passing of the bill, all citizens will have 12 months to be registered into the database. All babies born after January 1<sup>st</sup> of the year that follows the passing of the bill, will be finger printed upon birth.
