History Now Project: American Histories, circa 2019

I hope you have noticed that each chapter of our textbook opens with an **AMERICAN HISTORIES** introductory section: a pair of contrasting biographies, featuring two people (usually "ordinary," not necessarily famous people) with very different life experiences, who each represent their time period in some important way and help showcase American diversity.

Imagine that we have been assigned to start a new Chapter 30 for this textbook, featuring US history since 2015. I want you to write the "American Histories" opening section by selecting two people who represent our current historical moment with contrasting life experiences. Try to make them as different from each other and represent as wide a range of American diversity, as you possibly can. Both of the people need to have been alive at some point during 2015-2019. It may help you to go back and study some of the sections in previous chapters to see some good examples and to get a feel for the appropriate writing style.

Some people are off limits: no presidents or former presidents.

Essay Formatting

- 600 Words (or within 20 words of that limit, plus or minus)
- Only write about two actual, specific, individual, named people (i.e. cannot be a fictional person, and don't use broad categories of people like "Twitter users" or "Antifa")
- Use reliable sources about these people to craft their biographies (see citation note on the reverse side about Wikipedia if you absolutely have to use it)
- Keep the biographies of the two people about the same length as each other, strive for balance
- Use one paragraph either in the middle or at the end, to link, connect, compare and/or contrast your people
- Attach a source list, or use footnotes to cite sources
- Notes / sources are not part of word count
- Include the word count at the beginning of your essay
- You do not need to include photographs of the people

Rules for Wikipedia use
